



Oakley City Council June 10, 2020

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1. Call to order and roll call

Ty Turley, a filmmaker, stated interested in making a documentary film about the Oakley 2020 Rodeo. He would like to interview leaders of the town and community throughout the process. He asked for permission to film public meetings, interviews, and the rodeo. Mayor Woolstenhulme asked councilmembers to share their thoughts. Councilmember Frazier did not think that would be a problem. Councilmember Steve Wilmoth stated that he would not have objections but would like the main content of the filming to be mainly about the rodeo. Councilmember Smart stated he had not objections to Oakley being filmed.

Sam Aplanalp stated that he serves on the rodeo committee and there is some concern over footage that takes place in the arena and that there may be issues with the PRCA which own all filming rights. Mr. Turley said he would try to make sure he does not violate any of Oakley's contracts with the PRCA.

All councilmembers agreed that Mr. Turley could move forward with making the film.

2. Franson Trail Fencing – Rex Ballou, Franson Estates HOA President, asked City Council about fencing around his property that abuts the Franson Trail. Councilmember smart stated that he spoke with the trail foundation and he would connect Mr. Ballou with the foundation to find a solution. Mayor Woolstenhulme asked Councilmember Smart and Mr. Ballou to work with the trails foundation and find an agreeable solution. Mr. Ballou stated he wanted the city to be a part of the solution.

3. Fourth of July Celebration

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41 A. Ticket Policy for City Councilmembers

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43 Amy Rydalch, City Planner, presented information about sponsors for the 2020 Rodeo. Because of the positive
44 response from sponsors, Ms. Rydalch stated that the city would have to move some of the tickets from July 2 to
45 July 3-4. There was general discussion regarding which nights to re-arrange and how many tickets City Council and
46 City Staff should be allowed. The council decided on six tickets per night per councilmember, staff, or rodeo
47 committee member. City Council discussed the social distancing measure that would be in place as well as the
48 requirement to wear a face covering when social distancing is not possible.

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50 B. Meals for Rodeo Volunteers

51 Councilmember Wilmoth stated that in the past city council has provided meals to volunteers. Councilmember
52 Smart stated that Ken Garff Mercedes has already promised meal ticket vouchers that could be given to
53 volunteers. Councilmember Wilmoth said that could be a good solution. Councilmember Frazier asked Ms. Rydalch
54 if Bill White would be providing any meals. Rustin Young, Rodeo Committee member, said Mr. White has typically
55 provided breakfast and he may provide some sort of meal during the celebration, but that is not settled.

56 C. Fourth of July Parade

57 In lieu of a traditional parade city staff suggested a "Parade of Homes" where residents will decorate their lawns
58 and yards in place of a traditional float. City staff will provide a yard stakes with numbers for the public and
59 advertise via a newsletter, post on the city website, and social media channels.

60 D. Patriotic Program

61 Councilmember Frazier will oversee the Patriotic Program. Councilmember Bowen suggested holding it on the
62 lawn near the Red Barn instead of the arena or at an indoor venue. Councilmember Frazier said he liked the idea
63 and would coordinate with Tami Morrison, Choir Director, to make plans and arrangements.

64 E. Other Fourth of July Items

65 Mayor Woolstenhulme stated that Amy Iverson, an Oakley Resident and head of the SSHS Fauvines, had
66 information about the 4th of July 5K to post to the website. He also discussed parking for the rodeo.

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68 4. Regular Business

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70 A. Approval of Bills

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72 *Councilmember Wilmoth made a motion to pay the bills. Councilmember Frazier seconded. Motion passed (5:0).*

74 B. Regular City Business

75 Kendell Staples, Public Works Director, said that Dallas and Roman have been updating water meters around town.
76 He stated that summer help has been going well and that things are going well with city grounds. Mayor
77 Woolstenhulme thanked him for his work. City Council asked for an update on the Maple Ridge water meter. Mr.
78 Staples reported that it had not been set up correctly in the first place and Dallas was working to fix the situation.
79 Councilmember Smart asked about the water system chlorination process. Mayor Woolstenhulme said that Larry
80 Hall, Aqua Engineering, was looking into it and they would have an update soon.
