1. Mayor Woolstenhulme Opened the meeting. The invocation was offered by **Councilmember Kimber**. **Councilmember Frazier** led the Pledge of Allegiance.

2. Public Comment for Items not listed on the agenda:
NONE.

3. Regular City Business:

a. Approve EFT Vendors for Oakley City

Councilmember Frazier made a motion to approve the EFT Vendor's list for Oakley City. **Councilmember Wilmoth** seconded the motion. All voted in favor. **EFT Vendor list approved.**

b. Fraud Assessment

Councilmember Wilmoth made a motion to approve the 2021 Fraud Assessment as presented.

Councilmember Neff seconded the motion. All voted in favor. **2021 Fraud Assessment Accepted.**

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c. Benevolence Ratification- Julian Anderson Memoria

Councilmember Smart made a motion to ratify the benevolence adjustment to the Casey & Julianne Anderson Utility Billing and the donation of the use of the Red Barn facility for related funeral services. **Councilmember Wilmoth** seconded the motion. All voted in favor. **Benevolence Actions Ratified.**

d. 2022 City Council Meeting Dates

Councilmember Neff made a motion to accept the 2022 City Council meeting dates. **Councilmember Smart** seconded the motion. All voted in favor. **Calendar is accepted.**

e. Approval of the Invoice Register

Councilmember Frazier made a motion to approve the invoice register. **Councilmember Kimber** seconded the motion. All voted in favor. **Invoice Register Approved.**

4. Oakley Pastures Plat Amendment – CANCELED

5. Proposed Change to Water Features Regulation – off season filling of ponds.

Water Operator Hansen proposed to allow the filling of water features, ponds, lakes, pools, etc., currently restricted due to the moratorium, during the winter and early spring months. During this time-period the City usually experiences a redundancy of water supply. Standard rates would apply.

Councilmember Smart recommended adding time-frame parameters for this type of filling.

Councilmember Neff recommended adding a stipulation that allows for filling only during redundancy of water.

Councilmember Smart put forward a motion to amend the current water feature moratorium to allow for filling of water features from November 15th – April 15th so long as water source redundancy exists.

Councilmember Wilmoth seconded the motion. All voted in favor. **Amendment Passes.**

6. Summit Land Conservancy – Cheryl Fox

Cheryl Fox from Summit Lands Conservancy presented the City Council with two plaques in appreciation of the City’s support of the two recent Conservancy projects, Stevens Grove and Riverbend.

Mayor Woolstenhulme recommended that the City retain the services of a trapper to address the beaver problem at Stevens Grove before Spring. **Councilmember Smart** is to follow through with this item.

7. Mayor Items – Recommendations for Future Oakley City Business


Mayor Woolstenhulme addressed the Council and expressed his desire to preserve the heritage and rural qualities of Oakley City. He stated the importance of continuing our volunteer participation and encouraging new members of our community to get involved. He encouraged the Council to consider improvements to the Arena Complex. He shared several sentiments regarding the accomplishments of the Council during his tenure.

84 Councilmember Wilmoth addressed Mayor Woolstenhulme on behalf of the Council and
